**Professor for New Testament and Ancient Judaism (W 3)**

at the Institutum Judaicum Delitzschianum, with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2013.

The successful candidate will cover the full range of both New Testament and Ancient Judaism in research and teaching. S/he will automatically be the Director of the Institutum Judaicum Delitzschianum at the Faculty. The language used for teaching purposes is German.

The successful candidate will have completed his or her university studies, and will have a doctorate in studies concerning the New Testament and Second Temple Judaism. S/he will have acquired additional relevant scholarly qualifications, *e.g.* as a junior professor, by habilitation, or as an assistant professor at a university or in other institutions, or through scholarly activity in business, administration or other institutions in Germany or abroad.

The successful candidate should offer outstanding expertise in both New Testament and Jewish studies of the Second Temple period.

We explicitly encourage women to apply. The applications of women with equal aptitude, qualification and academic achievement will be given priority, provided there are no prevailing reasons to the contrary that arise from a competing candidate's application.

Candidates with physical disabilities offering the same qualifications will be preferred.

The deadline for applications including a CV, certificates, a publication list and information about teaching experience in higher education is 31<sup>st</sup> July 2012. Publications should be handed in on request only.
