Greek pseudo-civic coinages: a reality long unsuspected

Ancient Greek and Roman coins were struck for public expenses, which means firstly for military purposes. As it is more and more recognized, many coinages which look civic and were until recently considered as such were actually struck at a higher level. The lecture put in perspective what originally appears as a Persian practice (in Northern Greece, in Aegean islands, in Pontus, in Pamphylia-Cilicia, in Phoenicia), imitated by Hellenistic kings (from Alexander to Mithridates) and quickly adapted by the Romans in the East.
