The Hidden Meaning of Thomas More's Utopia

With an emphasis on its classical sources, this lecture will endeavour to unravel the various threads constitutive of the making of Thomas More's *Utopia*. More weaves together elements of Greek and Latin philosophy – especially Plato, Lucian and Cicero – and revisits them within a Christian conception of man's destiny.

The fable itself has been understood diversely since 1516, from a mere joke to a serious political programme, hence the rich historiography of its reception. Understanding how *Utopia* was read gives us an invaluable insight into the dreams and desires of its readers at various times in history.

Attempting a comprehensive look at *Utopia*, the lecture wishes to uncover what was for Thomas More his most intimate intention and desire in offering the learned Europeans of his time his "little fancy", first called *Nusquama*, then *Utopia*.
