# **WordSmith Tools Workshop**

## **with Mike Scott, author of WordSmith Tools**

**Monday January 26<sup>th</sup>, 2015, 16-17:30**

### **Objective**

To develop familiarity with WordSmith Tools 6.0 and the uses to which it may be put in investigating patterns in language use.

### **Plan**

We will begin with a run-through of what corpus tools can (and cannot) help with in relation to language study with reference to WordSmith Tools and its functions. An important aim though is to work practically, each participant using or sharing a laptop to try functions out. The idea is to help to grow one's skills with this quite complex and still-developing suite and learn new functions.

1. view the basics of what the suite of tools offers and ensure all participants can carry out procedures generating straightforward word-lists, concordances and key-word analyses.
2. go into advanced features, including import/export of data, text and file format issues, mark-up, data filtering and highlighting, processing word clusters, collocational statistics.
3. provide space for participants to raise research issues and obtain consultancy.

**Mike Scott** was originally trained as a language teacher, working in EFL first in Brazil, then in Mexico and then in the 1980s back in Brazil with the Brazilian ESP Project. He taught Applied Linguistics in the University of Liverpool and in Aston University. But since the mid 1980s what was originally a hobby, playing around with computers, took him into writing software for himself, his students and then for linguists more generally, and his main research interests have centred on Corpus Linguistics since then. He published his first program (MicroConcord) with Tim Johns in 1993 and since 1996 there have been various versions of WordSmith Tools (versions 1 to 4 published by Oxford University Press), which has become well established and used in many countries and with many languages including some which are only beginning to be described. He has now retired from teaching but continues to develop and support WordSmith Tools.
