Job Description:

As a senior lecturer you will be mainly involved in teaching Czech and Slovak linguistics (both synchronic and diachronic). Knowledge of other Slavic languages (especially West Slavic ones) and broad philological background knowledge are an advantage, the readiness to give introductory and overview lectures is a must. We expect the successful candidate to remain up to date with the current state of research, to undergo continuous education and training in didactics and to conduct research when no classes are being held. In addition, the University of Vienna expects the successful candidate to fulfill administrative tasks, in particular teaching administration.

In case of a positive evaluation at the end of the term of employment, the employment contract may be extended for an indefinite period of time.
