

# RECET Opening Week (online), 20-23 April 2021

At the Research Center for the History of Transformations (RECET), we use the post-1989 transformations in Central and Eastern Europe as a starting point for the comparative study of social, economic, and cultural transformations in the wake of deep historical caesuras at different times and in different parts of the world. Our concept of transformation is inspired by Karl Polanyi and looks beyond the hegemonic post-1989 teleologies of marketization and democratization. This approach also allows us to take a longue-durée perspective on transformations, with emphasis on the interdisciplinary connections to sociology, economics, and cultural and social anthropology.

Research at RECET is organized in five thematic clusters:

- -Labor Relations and Transformations "From Below"
- -Economic Thought and Reform Politics
- -Social Movements and Volunteerism
- -Migration and Transnationalism
- -Cultural Transformations

Following a concept of Comparative Area Studies, we widen our focus on Central and Eastern Europe by comparisons and the study of entanglements with other world regions, such as East Asia, and of the co-transformation of Western countries. A further aim of RECET is the revival of social history, in close connection with the Polish tradition of historical sociology.

For our Opening Week, we assemble some of the leading experts on East European and East Asian transformations past and present, and on historical and ongoing transformations of capitalism and democracy more generally. We invite the public to join us online for four evenings of exciting discussions on how our world has become what it is, and how it keeps changing in times of multiple crises.
